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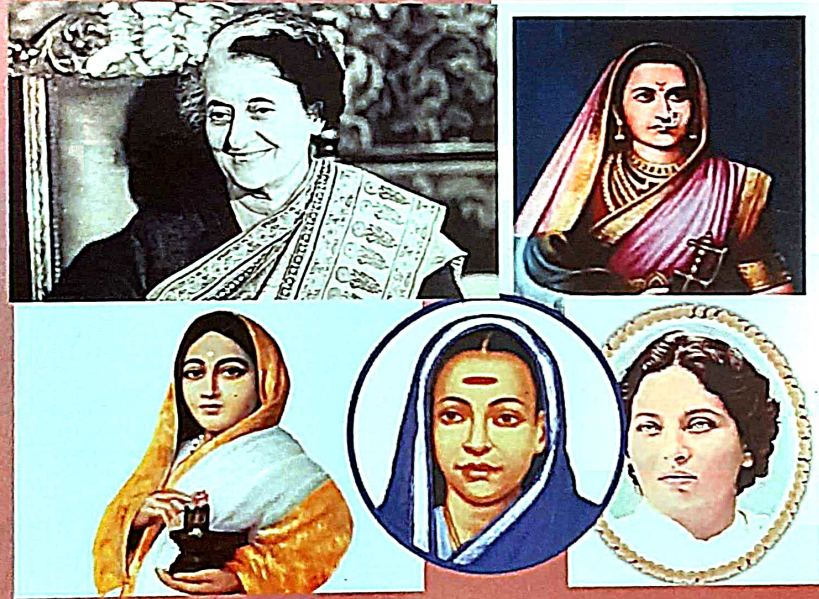
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Women and Globalization: An Overview

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The present age is the age of globalization where world is changing rapidly with the help of machines and technique. One can observe the aftermath of globalization in each and every sphere of human life. The universe is shrinking and bringing together various countries by broking the narrow domestic walls of caste, creed, religion, color, language and society. On the other hand, it has transformed world into market place. Globalization indicates that the world today is more interconnected than before. The term globalization was used in 1980 on an international level by the socialist, journalist and other persons involved in decision making. The word was first used in 1944 and included in the dictionary. Martin Albro says, "globalization means emergence of human community as a world society". Robert Cox observes it as, "a limited functions of international labour division, new migration, increasing competition between north and south and the rights of the state". Martin Khor differently opines it as, "An old pattern of colonization in the third world". Globalization is named differently in various fields in the field of climate it is called as 'global warming' in the production field it is 'global factions in the army it is 'global weaponry'. In this way various aspects of globalization is observed in various fields in the current years. According to Advered S. Herman, "globalization is the expansion across international borders of management and process. At the same time, it is a condition of facilities and economic relation which is constantly expanding and it is simultaneously changing". Whereas Oxford dictionary defines it, "the processes by which businesses or other organizations develop international influence or start operating on an international scale". Wikipedia the free encyclopedia defines it, "Globalization is the connection of different parts of the world resulting in the expansion of international cultural, economic and political activities. It is the movement and integration of goods and people among different countries. There are advantages and disadvantages to globalization, all of which have economic, social, political and cultural impacts".

The above definitions clearly disclose that globalization is an international process affect each and every aspects of modern human life, it will turn some into winners and others into losers. As it has affected man in the same way it has affected woman as well who is the half of the humanity. The paper aims at to study the changing role of women due to globalization. In the lives of women in developing world the improvement is observed worldwide in the current wave of globalization. Nevertheless women remain disadvantaged in many areas of life including education, employment health and civil rights. Various studies and statistical data proved that majority of women are still devoid of education and the deaths during pregnancy and even killed due to her secondary status in the world comparatively to man. Over the ages, women have to face the problems of such as patriarchy and social pressures, caste based discrimination and social restrictions; inadequate access to productive resources; poverty; insufficient facilities for advancement; powerlessness and exclusion etc. Globalization made them available an avenues to improve their status in the society, as every improvement has both sides white and black, globalization is also no exception.

Positive Effects

1) Changing Role in Employment:- Traditionally woman were restricted to family only. She was not allowed to take decisions in family as well. She has to bound herself on in daily chores like preparing food, cleaning, serving food, rearing children etc., She was restricted to family for many reasons, one of the important reason is that she is considered weak hence not considered secure outside home. Traditional patriarchal society bound her to family from ages and also keen on gender roles. But globalization enabled women to cross the threshold of the home and achieve her career outside home. The traditional businesses were already ruined in industrial revolution and the next step is globalization. Joint families which were the centers of her shackles were demolished in industrial revolution; the families have to settle in industrial area particularly in urban area due to the demolition of small scale traditional rural industries. Nuclear families were settled in large number which creates new avenues for women to come out of home and involve in employment. It was not possible to lead life on the meager income of males so women even children have to involve in employment. Industrial revolution becomes successful in bringing them out of home but their status at these working places were lowest workers only which allowed to a lowest salary comparatively to men. Globalization which is the further step of industrial revolution developed their status at working places and even attractive salary equal to men. It created new avenues for working women to come up and earn



their bread and butter and be financially independent resulted in their improvement of status in family and society as well.

Changing Role in Society:-

I) Family:- Patriarchal society had restricted her in family also. She was not allowed many basic rights in the family and not involved in decision making capacity. But globalization availed her opportunity to be economically independent and hence automatically her status at family become important. Being bread winner of the family she has now become decision maker of the family. Now she is able to earn equal with men and sometimes even more than him that place her on an important position in the family.

II) Marriage:- Patriarchal system, religion and society had a very severe rules for marriage. Marriage within the same caste were preferred by society and considered to retain sanctity and purity. Due to the restriction upon marriage she had to adjust and had to marry even an unsuitable partner and had to adjust with him in the whole life.

In globalization she is exposed to the working class more and marriage within the same caste and class has become less important. She has become choosy now and can chose more efficient partner irrespective of caste. Inter-caste marriages enable her to break the baseless superstition like caste system.

III) Caste System:- Caste system in India particularly was strictly observed in society. It was a system which divides Hindus into rigid hierarchal groups based on their *Karma* (work) and *Dharma* (duty) is generally accepted to be more than three hundred years old. It is class structure that is determined by birth. It is a very inhuman and unjust system for any individual where any unable person gets importance due to his high caste and an able person remains behind due to his lower caste. It would not be unreal if one say globalization uprooted the caste system to some extent which is beneficial for lower caste women who were in double lock being women and being lower caste. The changes brought by globalization created new opportunities for them.

IV) Education:- Women were kept aloof for a long time from the facilities like education. Lack of education created a lot of problem to achieve their overall progression. Globalization made available higher and quality education for those women who can afford them economically and socially.

V) Employment:- Women were not allowed neither to take education nor to do job outside of home. Industrialization made them to go outside and secure jobs though as a worker in industries with the country. Globalization made available employment in technological and other advanced sectors outside of the country. Suitable and qualified women are now securing their jobs available in other countries as well.

Negative Effects

Every transformation has both positive and negative sides. Globalization has also its negative sides. Due to saturation in the field of employment a low paid part time and contract basis jobs are increasing in number. Increased prices due to open economy demand more cope up with changes from women. Because of industrialization nuclear families are growing in number. Globalization kept the progress of nuclear families in number which lead miserable condition of older women. They have to spent their older age in isolation, not supported by their own children lead them to survive on a meager income and without company which is needed in that age. The men are migrating to the urban areas for employment leaving their women behind shouldering the whole responsibility of family and agriculture.

Conclusion:-

Globalization offers women new avenues at the same time it has challenged their talent as well. No doubt it has changed her lifestyle and improved her status in the society, offered her self-identity, confidence, braveness and secure position. Simultaneously it has created problems like her insecurity, burden, tension and a lonely life for old women.
